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The Festival of Lessons and Carols is a service of Christian worship traditionally celebrated on or near Christmas Eve. The story of the fall of humanity, the promise of the Messiah, and the birth of Jesus is told in nine short Bible readings or lessons from Genesis, the prophetic books and the Gospels, interspersed with the singing of Christmas carols, hymns and choir anthems.

The origin of the service can be traced back to England in the mid-1800s.

# The Eighth Lesson – Matthew 2:1-12

The Magi are led by the star to Jesus.
